


South Utica Newsletter #17 from **Councilperson Celeste Friend**



Resolutions I Voted For: June 2nd: Resolution to Create a "Utica Common Council" Facebook page (this was "full council" and passed unanimously; Resolution to Amend Appendix A to Section 2-2-86 of the Utica City Code Re: Financial Disclosures;

for Creative Arts. I was the original sponsor and promoter of this legislation, but I was very pleased when everyone on the Council saw the value of this Resolution. The Resolution went "full council", meaning we all sponsored it, and we passed it unanimously. **Ordinances I Voted For:** June 2nd: Ordinance for Handicapped Parking Locations on Maple Street;

Ordinance for "Car-Free Sundays in Roscoe Conkling Park" (it failed, with Moody, McNeil, and myself voting for it. Burmaster, Meola, Betrus, Williamson, LoMedico, and DiBrango all voted against it.) June 16th: Ordinance to Discontinue a Portion of Ash Street; Ordinance to

place a Stop sign at Highland Ave & Downer Ave; Ordinance for No Parking at all times on a portion of Hazelhurst Avenue (alongside Gilmore Park); An Ordinance Establishing a Temporary Moratorium on Conveniences and Smoke Shops in the City of Utica (for six months); a pair of Ordinances rescinding No Parking at All Times on Brinckerhoff Avenue and adding No Parking at All Times on a portion of Brinckerhoff Avenue (this pair of Ordinances fine tuned the No Parking portion of Brinckerhoff, per Councilperson Moody's

assessment of the needs of the street); An Ordinance Authorizing Sale of Wine and Beer to Handshake.City **Ordinances I Vote to Send to Committee** June 16: having placed a temporary moratorium on all new convenience and smoke shops in the City of Utica, we then voted to send to committee three
